Since June is traditionally the month of weddings it makes me think of the upcoming marriage supper of the lamb. As you know scripture refers to believers as 'the Bride of Christ', Jesus is our returning bridegroom. In a traditional Jewish wedding ceremony the bride and bridegroom are betrothed and the bridegroom returns to his father's house to begin preparing a place for his new bride. After a period of

waiting (not even the bride knows when to expect the bridegroom's return) the bridegroom receives his Father's permission to go get his bride. He leads a grand procession of friends and relatives down the street of the bride's residence to collect her, with shofars and harps announcing his arrival. She must be ready to go with him at all times. She actually spends the months or year of waiting preparing herself for him. Her mother helps her stay prepared for him, her girlfriends help her stay focused. When the bridegroom collects his bride, they proceed to his father's house for a huge feast and celebration. Does this remind you of what is waiting for us? After Jesus' resurrection, He returned to heaven (his Father's house) to prepare a place for us (His bride). He promised to return for us (with the blowing of the trumpet and a grand procession) and take us to His Father's house for the great marriage supper of the lamb. Here we, His bride will be presented as clean and spotless (being covered with His righteousness and washed in His blood). So my question to you this month is how are you spending your preparation period waiting for Jesus. You need to continually cultivate your love relationship with Jesus during the time you are waiting for His return. Read His love letter to you often (the Bible), communicate with Him continually (through prayer and just talking to Him), most of all spend time worshipping and adoring Him. Sing love songs to Him, tell Him how He has won your heart and you cannot wait to see Him. These are all things that brides do to prepare themselves for their bridegrooms.

When I look into my wife's eyes I see her love for me, when I read the words of our Father and His son Jesus I realize just how much they love The word love occurs 156 times in the King James in the New Testament. If you add all endings it occurs 202 times. I think my favorite is still -- John 3:16-19 (KJV) ¹⁶For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. ¹⁷For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved. ¹⁸He that believeth on him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God. ¹⁹And this is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil. Doesn't it just give you the warm fuzzies to think that God loved you and I so much that he would let his only son die for us. As we approach fathers day this year I think just how much my God loves us. As a father no matter how mad I ever got at the kids I would have never thought to hurt them. Oh, yes they did get spanked when they were in trouble, but most of the time all it took was "that look". As Isaiah tells us: Isaiah 55:8-9 (KJV) For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, saith the LORD. 9For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts. I did get to talk to dad the night he died. I did not know it would be the last time I would get to talk to him. My mom called concerned about dad's health. I talked to dad and he seemed fine. What I did not realize was being 16 hours from them, dad had been hiding the true condition of his health from me. I did get to tell dad that night I loved him, but I did not tell him just one more time how much Jesus loved him. I was

awakened at 2 am by a strange voice on the other end of the phone. It asked "if this was Jay Warner", I answered "yes", they answered " Jay your dad's dead" and the rest is history.

My friends if your parents, sisters, brothers, etc. are not saved please don't give up. You may still win them! Never, never let that chance to tell someone how much Jesus loves them go by, because it may be your last chance. Oh yes, because I know where I am going when it is all over this son would gladly give his live now to save his father.

This Months Bible Moment



Faith when nothing else works

Have you ever been at the end of you rope, so to speak, I have many times. It seems that when the Lord truly wants to get my attention He lets me do things that get me to the end of my rope. I have been so close to the end of my rope during my life I was sure that I heard each and every strand of the rope individually breaking. Counting them plink, plink, plink wondering which plink would be my last.

I am reminded what Solomon said in Ecclesiates. Ecclesiastes 4:9-11 (KJV) ⁹Two are better than one; because they have a good reward for their labour. ¹⁰For if they fall, the one will lift up his fellow: but woe to him that is alone ¹¹Again, if two lie when he falleth; for he hath not another to help him up. together, then they have heat: but how can one be warm alone? When we are "hanging in there" we are not doing it alone! Our Lord promises us that 1 Corinthians 10:13 (NASB) ¹³No temptation has overtaken you but such as is common to man; and God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will provide the way of escape also, so that you will be able to endure it. Our Lord loves us so much that when we are sent through temptations and trials He will not let us be overcome. He will make sure that we can endure it. So then you may ask why do so many fail and fall away? Why do so many give in to temptation? Because we do not have the faith in God to endure until the end. Jesus said " he who endures to the end will be saved". Many times humans fail and fall away from the Lord because they will not endure to the end. Notice I said "will not" not could not. If we believe that the word of God is true and faithful then it was not God's fault. We are told "but with temptation will provide the way of escape also, so that you will be able to endure". We can endure if we have that three fold cord talked about in Ecclesiates 4:12 ¹²And if one prevail against him, two shall withstand him; and a threefold cord is

not quickly broken. In our camp meeting sermon series Evangelist Dale Smith preached on the 3 fold cord. He took a rope and made three strands out of it. Then he tied it to a cross bar and attached a heavy load. As he talked about trials and temptations in life he cut one more of the strands that made up the 3 fold cord. Each time the people gasped waiting for the

load to drop. Finally he preached how we lose our faith in God and try to make it ourselves. When he cut that last strand "God's strand" the thickest, the strongest, that heavy load came crashing down. You talk about our Lord's sense of humor, right at that moment a loud thunder crash happened. I thought we were going to lose several of the older members of our group.



My point is who are our eyes upon? Our situations, or on the Lord? Each and every time we take our eyes off the Lord and put them on the world we open the door for us to stumble. We open up the door that weakens our faith. When you're hanging at the end of that rope and you can hear each and every plink, plink, plink as the strands break. As you get closer to that final fall are you clawing at the rope trying to get above the weak spot? Are you not admitting you need help by saying "go ahead and make my day, I work better under pressure"! Or are you saying praises to Jesus because he is in control and will not let you fall? He promised that those who endure to the end will be saved. Jesus came because he loved us enough to give us life more abundantly. But he can not give us life more abundantly if we do not hold onto that faith and know that He will provide as He promised. Our God is never late. He often shows up at the last minute just to test our faith.

When this pastor has found himself hanging from the last few strands and is counting the plink, plink, plink of the strands breaking, he is singing praises and knows Jesus is in control. He knows that when that last plink happens and he is falling that the hand of Jesus is just below him to catch him. Will you let Jesus catch you?

Praise you Jesus for all the trails to build our faith. Thy will be done Lord Jesus.

Psalm 91

- ⁵ Thou shalt not be afraid for the terror by night; *nor* for the arrow *that* flieth by day;
- ⁶ Nor for the pestilence that walketh in darkness; nor for the destruction that wasteth at noonday.
- ⁷ A thousand shall fall at thy side, and ten thousand at thy right hand; *but* it shall not come nigh thee.
- ⁸ Only with thine eyes shalt thou behold and see the reward of the wicked.

As we sit down, remain in, settle ourselves, and are married to this hidden place in the elevated lofty Surpreme God, consider the result. We will remain and continue in the shade and defense of the burly, powerful, Almighty.

Starting with salvation and repentance from sin, this place of staying in God's word, and prayer, and peace, and contentment is our continuing confidence and guidance through God's Holy Spirit. Do exactly what this psalm says, meditate in it, respect it, keep it, learn it, and so on. We not only hear of the destruction, and the warnings to fear God to escape judgment, but we hear of the many benefits we have in Christ. Some folks don't understand how you can have a relationship with a God that doesn't seem to be there when you need Him or He doesn't seem to care. Some will say, "What good does it do?" Hebrews 11:6 says, "But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him." We must believe that God cares about us and has a plan for our lives. And if we continue, not having received the promises, just as Abraham did in Hebrews 11:13, God puts His righteousness on

our account. But we must turn away from our sins, and come to God on His terms. Do we call Him Lord and do not do what He says? Sin separates us from God. And if we harbor sin we will surely walk away from God's protection. It was this sin that drove Christ to the cross. If we are truly sorry for our sin we must turn away.

The whole armor of God is exactly that, God's armor. What soldier supplies his own equipment? After he is issued his rifle doesn't it still belong to the issuing party? And the same with the rest of the armor of Ephesians chapter 6 should apply. Are we at the point of Eph 6:10-18? Do I exchange my strength for His strength, as in, Be strong in the Lord? By waiting upon God our strength is changed, by believing, and abiding. Is the belt of truth (God's word) intact about our hips, to the point that I don't make a move without it? Is our heart protected with the breastplate of righteousness, covered with Christ's righteousness, and in our own lives turning away from sin? Notice in Ephesians 6 that part of our armour is knowing how to share the gospel, and we are ready before we go out. Above all, taking the shield of faith, here we are again. Faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God. Rom 10:17. On our jobs we wouldn't think of going without our hardhats, or going on a motorcycle without a helmet, and so our helmet of salvation must be kept in place, only through Christ. Only with this helmet in place can we do battle in the heavenly realm. The sword of the Spirit, is not only our defense, it is our authority and confidence as well. It is the very weapon that Jesus used and that will never fail till all be fulfilled. After we've done all to stand, such as putting on God's armor, let us remain standing for the One who bought us with His blood. Praying the Word, standing on the Word, remaining in the Word, we are to stand and pray. Revelation talks about our prayers coming before God's throne. Hebrews 4:16 says that we should come boldly before God's throne to obtain the mercy and grace we need. There is a place of protection and strength that will never fail. No foe will be able to break in and plunder. If my hope is in my comfort that will surely fail. If my hope is in my health that can fail, after all, we are appointed already once to die. Meditate in these scriptures that we have mentioned here and you too, with God's help, will receive strength and boldness to carry on. Not only for your strength and confidence, and for your peace, but as Peter encourages us, "be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear." (1Pet 3:15) If I am in the midst of the storm yet my mind and my hope is dwelling in the secret place of the Most High, and I am not afraid, is this not a testimony to the world around us that God's grace is sufficient. Remember Acts 17:11 that these were more noble in that they received God's word with all readiness of mind, and searched the scriptures to make sure these things were so...

TEACHING OF THE MONTH Are You Rapture Ready

My what an exciting time we are living in. With everything that is happening in this day and age, who knows what to expect next? I don't know what is going to be the next big headline in the newspaper, but I do know what is in store for the world as far as Bible prophecy is concerned. The rapture is the next big event for all Christians to be looking forward too. Even though you might know it by another name such as caught up, or called away, it still is what is to take place next in the grand scheme of things to come. The real question is are you ready for it to happen? Let's take a look at what the Bible has to say about being ready to be caught up. So how are we really to prepare ourselves, well first we are to attend church. The Bible tell us clearly and in no uncertain terms we should do this and on a regular basis and why. Here is what Hebrews10:25 has to tell us. "Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some [is]; but exhorting [one another]: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching." We are also to partake of the Lord's Supper in such a way that we should not only be remembering him but also thinking about his return. The Bible tells us in 1 Cor.11:25-26 "After the same manner also [he took] the cup, when he had supped, saying. This cup is the new testament in my blood: this do ye, as oft as ye drink [it], in remembrance of me. 11:26 For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do shew the Lord's death till he come. " We are also to show love toward believers and all men. Look at 1 Thess 3:12-13 "And the Lord make you to increase and abound in love one toward another, and toward all [men], even as we [do] toward you: 3:13 To the end he may stablish your hearts unblameable in holiness before God, even our Father, at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ with all his saints." I guess that means we had better be putting up those so called Holy Ghost Machine Guns, and show a little unconditional love toward our fellow man. Next we are to be patient with one another. Wait you mean love is not enough we have to be patient too? It would seem so or at least this is what James 5:8-9 has to say." Be ye also patient; stablish your hearts: for the coming of the Lord draweth nigh. 5:9 Grudge not one against another, brethren, lest ye be condemned: behold, the judge standeth before the door. "Well it seems that there are some pretty strict rules we as Christians need to be living under. I hope that everyone is following what the Bible has to say about being ready for the return of our glorious King. If we look a little further into the word, we would find that we are to live separate lives from the rest of the world. Here is what Titus 2:12-13 has to tell us. Teaching us that, "denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world; 2:13 Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ; "2 Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine Then after we become separated from the world we are not to be so quick in the judging of others. Or at least this is what I am getting out of 1 Cor. 4:4-5 "For I know nothing by myself; yet am I not hereby justified: but he that judgeth me is the Lord. 4:5 Therefore judge nothing before the time, until the Lord come, who both will bring to light the hidden things of darkness, and will make manifest the counsels of the hearts; and then shall every man have praise of God." Also we are called to preach the word of God to this lost

and dying world until the Lord returns. Look at what 2 Tim 4:1-4 has to teach us about this. "I charge [thee] therefore before God, and the Lord Jesus Christ, who shall judge the quick and the dead at his appearing and his kingdom; 4:3 For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears; 4:4 And they shall turn away [their] ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables." I am not saying everyone is to stand in the pulpit. But we are to preach to our neighbors. After all you might be the only way that they will ever hear sound gospel, instead of some kind of vain babbling. After all this is why we are to study to show ourselves approved as shown to us in 2 Tim.2:15-16. "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth. 2:16 But shun profane [and] vain babblings: for they will increase unto more ungodliness." In fact it almost seems that we are to do whatever it takes to win souls for Christ. I have heard, and even said in the past fear is not a good tactic for soul winning. Here I am proved to be very wrong in my thoughts in Jude. It would seem we should do whatever it takes to save someone from the pits of Hell. Here is what Jude has to tell us in verses 21-23. "Keep yourselves in the love of God, looking for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ unto eternal life. 1:22 And of some have compassion, making a difference: 1:23 And



others save with fear, pulling [them] out of the fire; hating even the garment spotted by the flesh. "Well it seems that the Bible is pretty clear on what each of us is to be doing in preparing for the rapture. The real question is, are we willing to do what it has to say or not. There is a payday coming and no one knows exactly when it will be. However, this one thing is for certain we all will receive our just payday

whether it be to live with Christ or to be doomed to the fiery pits of hell. Either way we have made the choice for ourselves.
