Pastor's Corner THE EXCESS OF AMERICA

Sometimes I just sit and wonder about how my Lord feels about the way American Christians are. What started this was that I read an article about a ministry leader and his wife. They earn over \$700,000 a year and are reported to own 30 homes with several costing over the one million dollar mark. I also read of a pastor of a famous ministry that had the ministry build a 6.4 million dollar mansion with a 10 car subterranean garage for his parsonage. The other day I sent out one of my e-mail teachings called "Whom do you fear". I happen to ask the question "why does anyone need 30 homes especially a Christian?" I got an e-mail telling me that there was nothing wrong with having giant salaries and 30 homes. What has happened to American Christians? I see so many big ministries that seem on the surface to be such "Godly" ministries, but as one looks closer one can see that one of the ministries purposes is to make the pastor rich. I once sent out a teaching straight out of the word of God saying how important it is for us to tithe. I pointed out that if we could afford to have several televisions, buy or rent the latest movies, go out to eat, we could afford to put our Lord first and tithe. I was accused of having a bitter-hateful spirit. What is happening to Christian America?

On a daily basis this ministry gets requests from pastors around the world for help. Not just monetary help but for prayer. We have so many standing invitations to come to other nations to preach I cannot keep track of them all. His Will Ministry currently takes the gospel to America, to the Philippians, to Malawi, to Uganda, to Ghana, to India, to Nigeria, to Russia, to Canada, to Nepal, to Venezuela, to Malaysia and is preaching to the Muslims in Sudan. This does not take into account all the countries and people we reach via the internet. Yet everyone on the staff are volunteers. In fact the ministry's accountants have informed me that if I do not take a salary, bonus etc. from the ministry then all the personal funding Mary and I do for the ministry is not tax deductible. Now do not misunderstand me, my Lord and Savior gave the work of this ministry to us. Therefore we will do what is required of us to perform the work He has given us. Both Mary and I and our director hold down full time jobs in the world to support the works God has given us. Quite an honorable place to be in when we consider that Paul worked his trade as a tent maker to support the ministry God gave him. Our secular work is the main reason we cannot go overseas and preach the Gospel.

It just saddens my heart (as I am sure it does God's) when I see such excess in America and so many ministries that are struggling. I know one minister who is 76 years old and still has to work because the members of his congregation will not support him. Sadly there are members of that church that would be considered rich even by American standards. Many times I wonder just what this ministry could do if everyone who receives the newsletter, the sermon tapes, the special gifts or listens and downloads the radio programs gave to this ministry.

I once had a very wise friend tell me " If I have not used something for over six months then I give it away because I don't need it. I just want it. " When I drive around our little town of Pinedale I am shocked by the ever increasing number of self storage centers. I was listening to a pastor preach on giving to the Lord. He said " I am so sick and tired of hearing you say "I want the Lord to bless me" American Christians are the most blessed Christians in the world. You are nothing more than spoiled brats." Not my words, his words to his congregation. I don't think I would ever go that far, but I do think we are the most blessed Christians in the world. Americans have such excess. The Lord makes it very plain and clear what he expects of us. He is to come first in all our life. If that extra television for the bedroom, if the newer car, that bigger house, the extra rifle for hunting, that new four wheeler, etc is more important than Jesus, then you are in the wrong place my friends. If spreading the gospel does not come before even your comfort then my friend you are not in the place Jesus wants you to be. Pastor Davies in Malawi just lost his sister. She died suddenly. He and his family had to travel to and pay for the funeral. Now he does not even have the funds to pay his and the churches bills. Pastor Davies is now seeking a job to keep his family and ministry going. Pastor Felisa and her 10 other pastors in the

Philippians meet in buildings made with straw that leak in the rain. They cannot even afford, Bibles, decent shoes, clothes and daily needs, yet they still preach the Gospel. They will spend days traveling to the far reaches sometimes walking in rain and mud just to hold a V.B.S.. It really saddens me that out of all those who receive from this ministry only one has made a commitment to give up something to help out these pastors.

It is not a pleasant thought but I firmly believe that on judgement day abundantly blessed Christians will be asked "what they did with what God gave them?" I believe that we will be shown all the opportunities the Lord gave us to help the less fortunate. Maybe we will even see their faces and the hardships they faced because we just could not part with our excess. Then we may see the "things" we just had to have instead. Mark my words friends there will come a time when we will all be held accountable for how we used all the blessings and excess the Lord has given us.

The Lord has made me a watchman and I know that our Father is not happy with us. He has made us the richest nation in history and yet in most churches less than 5% tithe and give. How will you answer on that day when we stand before Jesus and all is revealed?

We must realize that no two people are on the same path, and everyone has a specific purpose that God has chosen from the foundation of the earth, before the world was created.

Grace, amazing grace, and the words of that famous hymn by the same title, "Tis grace hath brought me safe thus far, And grace will lead me home." God's grace

that loved us before we loved him. God's perfect love allows us the freedom to call our own shots. And after we've blown it, the sinner that turns to God with a humble heart will find grace and mercy from the very God we nailed to a cross. That's amazing grace. It isn't a one time that's all you get grace. It's an everyday, ongoing process grace, enough grace that He will not turn you away as long as you turn to him, repentant sinner. That's me, and that's you. Love never gives up, God is not a quitter, and He won't quit on you. You can resist him, deny him, give up on him, but he hasn't given up on you.

The Lord is my shepherd; (Ps 23:1) Look at how the psalmist starts his confession. He doesn't start out I am a rock like a famous folk song. He acknowledges the one who has been his help all along. And as we continue in this psalm (Read Psalm 23) we see it is the Lord who has been our provider up to now. He saved me and protected me even before I knew him. My life should have ended with all the times I had close calls and had no regard for my own life.

Not only has he provided for me, (vs.1,2) after I made a wreck of my life, and it was so messed up, He took me broken, wasted, and filthy, and washed me, healed me, and restored my life (v.3). He gave me a hope. I don't know where you are at right now, but I know where I was at. I was in jail with the probability of going to prison for pushing a cop. I looked up Romans 10: 9, 10 and God's word produced faith in my heart. I asked Jesus to come into my life and save me. I didn't deserve it, but God's word changed my life.

The hymn 'My Burdens Rolled Away' says, "I remember when my burdens rolled away, I had carried them for years, night and day; when I sought the blessed Lord, and I took Him at His word, Then at once all my burdens rolled away. Rolled away, rolled away. Our only hope is to take Him at His word. Then we can truly say, "he leadeth me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me. Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever." (Ps 23) Take Him at His word.

Let your conversation be without covetousness; and be content with such things as ye have; for he hath said, I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee. (Heb 13:5) If we have Jesus what more do we need. It's not that we should just quit our jobs, or not try to better ourselves, but keep in mind that these things are so temporary and they are passing away.

Casting all your care upon him for he careth for you. (1 Pet 5:7) Is this where your confession is right now. O Lord my shepherd, you have provided your cross for my guilt. When I was hungry you fed me. You haven't brought me this far to forget me now. Show me Lord, restore me and lead me in the way everlasting, my Lord and my God. Jesus is the only name given among men whereby we must be saved. Let your confession be through and in the strong name of Jesus today, beloved. Keep your eyes on Jesus today, rest in His word, and trust in His grace.

This Months Bible Moment



The Fathers business

John 4:34-38: Then Jesus explained: "My nourishment comes from doing the will of God, who sent me, and from finishing his work. ³⁵Do you think the work of harvesting will not begin until the summer ends four months from now? Look around you! Vast fields are ripening all around us and are ready now for the harvest. ³⁶The harvesters are paid good wages, and the fruit they harvest is people brought to eternal life. What joy awaits both the planter and the harvester alike! ³⁷You know the saying, 'One person plants and someone else harvests.' And it's true. ³⁸I sent you to harvest where you didn't plant; others had already done the work, and you will gather the harvest."

Jesus said Luke 16:10¹⁰He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much: and he that is unjust in the least is unjust also in much. When His Will Ministry started Mary and I preached and worked where ever the Lord directed us. When we started the newsletter we sent out 4 copies the first run. Today we send out over 130 all over the world. I used to have a problem with ego and have worked very hard to be humble before man and God. You can ask Mary, she will tell you once in a great while I still have a minor problem, but I am human. But the Lord had laid it upon my heart to get a world map and plot where the ministry He runs has reached. We now reach over 30 nations with the newsletter, the over the air radio programs and our internet streaming. I was so busy just trying to preach the Gospel to the ends of the earth that I did not even realize we were! Below are the countries that His Will Ministry reaches.

United States; Canada; Lithuania; India; Brazil; New Zealand; Singapore; Australia; Japan; United Kingdom; Indonesia; Mexico; Bahamas; Belgium; Germany; Finland; Israel; Hungary; Mautrius; Peru; Netherlands; Italy; Botswana; Sweden; Pakistan; Russia; Philippians; Nigeria; Ghana; Uganda; Sudan; Malawi; Mozambique; Zambia.

Now do not get me wrong this is not what we call tooting our own horn. I will be totally honest this has nothing to do with <u>ANYONE</u> at His Will Ministry. If we get into the "ego thing" of "look how much I have done for the Lord" we will be in big trouble. If we are truly doing the work of the Lord we will be like Jesus, and say: "My nourishment comes from doing the will of God, who sent me, and from finishing his work. Each one of us who use the name Christian has a job to do for the Lord. You may not like it, but if you do not finish that job you will be judged about it during the final judgement.

Now you may ask (<u>I did</u>) why did the Lord chose to use Mary and I, and to expand this ministry. This has to do with two very simple Biblical principles. The first is found in Jesus' own words in Luke 16:10. He that is faithful with little will be allowed to be faithful in much. (paraphrased) We find this principle throughout the Bible. All of God's great men started out being faithful with the little they had and then the Lord added more. A few years ago the Jabez prayer was the all the rage. (1 Chronicles 4:10) All the books and hype said make this your battle cry and the Lord will do just as He did with Jabez. He will bless you abundantly. I know many, many people that prayed that prayer and saw no results. Why? because we must go back to Jesus' words "faithful with little". Jabez was faithful with the little he had. He had a personal relationship with the Lord or he could not have asked what he asked. My friend if you are not faithful with what the Lord has given you then how can you expect more from the Lord? Jesus summed it up by saying that doing and finishing the work of the Lord was more important to Him than even food. What is the most important thing in your life, a worldly possession, a loved one, a job? You cannot expect our Father in Heaven to bless your efforts if you cannot even be faithful in the little He has given you. Every Christian to ever walk this earth since Jesus' time has had a job to complete for the Father in Heaven and my friends you can take this to the bank. If you want the Lord to give you more you must be faithful with what He has already given you.

The second simple Bible principle is what Jesus made plain and clear in John 4:34-38 that the job every one of us has is to spread the Gospel. To tell someone about what Jesus has done for you. How hard is that? It is "not to sow your seed to meet your need". It is not to prayer "Father bless me abundantly". It is not to think that God is some Santa Claus in the sky. It is to do the Father's will and the Father's will is to bring as many into the kingdom of heaven as we can in our lifetimes.

You want to be blessed abundantly like the Lord has done with His Will Ministry? Jesus' words "The harvesters are paid good wages, and the fruit they harvest is people brought to eternal life." You want God's blessings, then get busy being part of the harvesters not sitting on the side lines. Get out in your neighborhood, get out in your city, get out in your own church and preach the gospel. Yes, your own Church. The statistics show that in most churches today many parishioners do not even have a true understanding of salvation. We have just brought them into the church and "assumed" they were saved.

I believe in the next few years you will see His Will Ministry's reach grow beyond anything we can conceive of. We have already seen doors open we could have never thought of. I believe we will be preaching live around the world. I believe we will preach the gospel to the ends of the earth and my Lord and Savior will get all the glory and honor. But I know this will only happen as long as we remain faithful to the little He gives us and we remain humble and know it has nothing to do with us but only Jesus.

If we Christians are to grow we must be humble and get out of Jesus' way! We must get our food from doing the Lord's work not ours! We must be about the Father's business! I leave you with the wise words in Acts 5:37 & 38 "So my

advice is, leave these men alone. If they are teaching and doing these things merely on their own, it will soon be overthrown. ³⁹But if it is of God, you will not be able to stop them. You may even find yourselves fighting against God."

If each Christian, or "His Will Ministry" becomes "our own will ministry" we will fail. But if we keep our eyes on the will of God no one will be able to stop us from preaching the gospel to the ends of the earth.

TEACHING OF THE MONTH

God's Love

Normally I do not do the teaching of the month but this month I feel led to. I have been hard on you and myself with my thoughts and the Bible moment, this month so I thought I would share some love with you. Our Lord has been doing a work in Mary's and my hearts. He has been taking us on the carpet about a few things. This is what happens to Christians when we seek to be only in the will of he Lord. We truly have no idea as young Christians what the Lord wants of our lives. We do not know the direction He has set for us. We must seek His will and grow closer to Him until He reveals His plan. As we grow closer we begin to see more and more of God's big picture. But the one thing that we should realize immediately is the love that God has for all His creatures, especially His special creation mankind.

Even as baby Christians we should be aware of the great love of the Lord for us and the desire of His that we reflect that love to all mankind. Just think of the kind of world we would live in is every Christian showed forth God's love to everyone? This is one thing that the Lord has been working on with me lately. He has been showing me that I still do not love the unlovely like He does. How can we as Christians reach the world if we do not love all of God's creations as much as He does? Let's look at Jesus' words in Matthew 25:31 on. 31 When the Son of man shall come in his glory, and all the holy angels with him, then shall he sit upon the throne of his glory: ³²And before him shall be gathered all nations: and he shall separate them one from another, as a shepherd divideth his sheep from the goats: 33And he shall set the sheep on his right hand, but the goats on the left. ³⁴Then shall the King say unto them on his right hand, Come, ye blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world: ³⁵For I was an hungered, and ye gave me meat: I was thirsty, and ye gave me drink: I was a stranger, and ye took me in: ³⁶Naked, and ye clothed me: I was sick, and ye visited me: I was in prison, and ye came unto me. 37Then shall the righteous answer him, saying, Lord, when saw we thee an hungered, and fed thee? or thirsty, and gave thee drink? ³⁸When saw we thee a stranger, and took

thee in? or naked, and clothed thee? ³⁹Or when saw we thee sick, or in prison, and came unto thee? ⁴⁰And the King shall answer and say unto them, Verily I say unto you, Inasmuch as ye have done *it* unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done *it* unto me. ⁴¹Then shall he say also unto them on the left hand, Depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels: ⁴²For I was an hungered, and ye gave me no meat: I was thirsty, and ye gave me no drink: ⁴³I was a stranger, and ye took me not in: naked, and ye clothed me not: sick, and in prison, and ye visited me not. ⁴⁴Then shall they also answer him, saying, Lord, when saw we thee an hungered, or athirst, or a stranger, or naked, or sick, or in prison, and did not minister unto thee? ⁴⁵Then shall he answer them, saying, Verily I say unto you, Inasmuch as ye did *it* not to one of the least of these, ye did *it* not to me. ⁴⁶And these shall go away into everlasting punishment: but the righteous into life eternal.

Now let's just take an inventory of what Jesus said, "For I was hungered and you gave me meat". This seems simple enough, if we see someone on the street that cannot afford a meal, do we take him or her and feed them? Jesus did not say that you set them up in a home and provided for them the rest of their lives. He said "you fed them." Ask yourself this question, "how many times have you seen someone hungry and just gone on by?" The second item on Jesus' list was you saw me thirsty and gave me a drink. Have you ever come across a worker in the hot sun, sweating and thirsty and just offered them a drink in Jesus name? Now on to the third, a stranger and you took me in. Here in Pinedale it gets very cold in the wintertime. If you are homeless you will die on the streets without shelter. A few years ago there was a homeless man in Rock Springs, Wyoming that many people had seen around town, yet no one would help him. Finally the local police ran him out of town. A few days later they found him frozen to death under a bridge. Not one of the churches in town would "take him in". Have you ever come across someone who just needed a little love and help to get back on their feet? Did you reach out or just go by? Time for the fourth on Jesus' list, I was naked and you clothed me. In today's world it is hard to keep a firm count of the number of homeless on the streets. A few years ago it was only the "dredges" of society that were living on the streets. Today many people on the streets are just like you and I, except for some event in their lives they could not recover from. Do you have an extra coat, shirt, pants, or dress hanging in your closet? Could that item clothe someone less fortunate? We are the most blessed Christians in history. There should not be one person on the streets of this country without a warm coat and a full stomach. The fifth item on the list is " I was sick and you visited me." This is one of my pet peeves. A couple of years ago we worked with a church 110 miles away from Pinedale. One of the parishioners became sick and was unable to go to church for a year until her death. Out of a membership of over 100 members only 3 or 4 visited her in that year. Do you know a shut in? Do you know a member of your church that can no longer come to church? Have you visited them? Is there someone who is in the hospital, a friend, co-worker, neighbor? Have you visited them? Finally Jesus says I was in prison and you visited me. This is where we so often let Him down. When men and woman are in prison they are so hungry for outside contact that their hearts are tender enough to accept God's love. We have one lady pastor that travels 30+ miles every Friday to do a jail ministry here in Pinedale. Her reward will be great. She has honored me on several occasions to let me conduct the jail ministry in her absence.

Now let's take a quick look. ³⁵For I was an hungered, and ye gave me meat: I was thirsty, and ye gave me drink: I was a stranger, and ye took me in: ³⁶Naked, and ye clothed me: I was sick, and ye visited me: I was in prison, and ye came unto me. Six small items of love that are not that hard to do. Jesus did not demand we become great preachers, great prophets, or great martyrs. He simply asked that we love our fellow man with the love He showed us. Think of what a better world it would be if each person that used the name of Christian could do just these six small things. Now I must point out that these are not six suggestions. These are things that Jesus requires of us. Look at verses 45 and 46 ⁴⁵Then shall he answer them, saying, Verily I say unto you, Inasmuch as ye did *it* not to one of the least of these, ye did *it* not to me. ⁴⁶And these shall go away into everlasting punishment: but the righteous into life eternal. It looks to me that these are not voluntary, but requirements of our Christian walk. We need to take an inventory of our walk and ask ourselves are we doing what Christ wanted.

Finally lets take a look at what Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians chapter 13 starting in verse 4

Love is patient and kind.

Love is not jealous, it does not brag, and it is not proud.

Love is not rude, is not selfish, and does not get upset with others.

Love does not count up wrongs that have been done.

Love is not happy with evil but is happy with the truth.

Love patiently accepts all things.

It always trusts, always hopes, and always remains strong.

This sums up how you and I should react to other Christians and the world If we look at each one of these we can see God's love shining around us. through each one. If our Lord was not patient and kind to me I would have been cast straight into hell a long time ago. But He was patient and kind and waited until I came to Him. Where would you be without His patient and kind love? If my Lord got jealous every time I have taken my eyes of Him over the years I would have been zapped by lighting years ago. Have you ever taken your eyes off Jesus? Has the Lord or the Holy Spirit been rude or openly upset with you. I know if the Lord had been rude to me like I have been rude to people in the past I would be in big trouble. Now here is the big one for me. What would we do if after we became Christians the Lord counted up the mistakes we made and continually pushed them back in our faces? Have you ever been there, where someone makes a mistake and hurts you and you just cannot let it go? You have to remind them at the most opportune time. Love does not hold a grudge. Can you imagine what our lives as Christians would be like if our Lord held a grudge against us? Remember you and I are just as responsible for Jesus hanging on the cross as the Jews during Jesus time were. Are we always happy when the truth comes out. As an old pastor friend used to tell me "You never mind the truth when you have nothing to hide." Love is patient. Boy that was a hard one for me in my early Christian life. But when you truly have God's love in your heart you have no time schedule. Just as an example, how long did the Lord have to be patient with you before you came to Him and accepted Him as your Savior. I guess the way I like to put it is just how much time is one soul worth, a day, a month, a year, or years? Can we ever put a time limit on how long we will continue to reach out to a soul in hopes that they will be saved?

I will leave you with this example. We know one beautiful Christian pastor and his wife that have been trying to reach Sublette County for the last 19 years. They have not and do not plan on giving up. I have seen the depth of this pastor's heart as he wept over the fact that in 19 years they have not seen the fruit of the seed they have sown. I then saw the resolve in his eyes and words saying they were not going to give up though.

Please take a hard look a Mathew 25: 31 on and I Corinthians chapter 13 and take an inventory of your love for others. I know when I do I still have a lot of growing to do. I have a long way to go before I am totally Christ like to all of God's creations. But I am willing to be open and learn how to be totally Christ like to the world. I just praise our Lord for His love and patience with me as I grow more like him.

Remember my friends we should never look back and say "oh, look at how much I have done for the Lord." We should always look forward and say "oh look at how much more the Lord could do through me if I could only love mankind like Jesus first loved me!"
